Test Results Of Grade 1 Learners (2012)




METHOD

- 42 Grade R practitioners were trained to implement the Basic Concepts Programme with all their learners.
- Learners who participated in the Basic Concepts Programme in Grade R in 2011 were tested during the first term of Grade 1 2012.
- A sample of 198 learners from 8 schools were tested – this represented 20% of the learner population.
- The learners were tested by the researcher.


Learner Results Following Intervention

Learner Results Following Intervention



Rationale:

Two sub-tests of the ASB were administered to all learners in order to make comparisons with the TBCK results.

Finding:

Learners who attained average to strong scores on the TBCK attained above average scores on the perception sub-test and just below average scores on a reasoning sub-test.

Conclusion:

The TBCK test results seemed to match with the results attained on the ASB for different groupings of learners.

Learner Results Following Intervention

The majority of learners (69%) who participated in the intervention programme in Grade R are school ready.
